• We are at 82% of our fundraising goal and that's probably where we will cap out for the end of the year. We are also underspending. We are on track with Homework Club expenses which is a big line item for PFC. We've only spent about a third of the department grants and a quarter of the teacher grants. I will send word to the teachers that the end of April is a soft deadline to turn in receipts.

- The 8th grade website is up now.I'll send the link in the chat if any parents on the meeting would like to start purchasing or donating to activities. There will be more information that will go out in the letter tomorrow. The only thing left for the 8th grade activities is to get an addendum to our insurance for the picnic. I will obtain that in the next couple weeks.
- The Treasurer role is pretty involved. You are handling all of the budget.
 Preparing it and presenting it to the board for approval. Then you manage the budget by writing checks, paying invoices and paying reimbursements. You also make sure the taxes are filed and insurance is paid. Anything dealing with money you are handling.
- I've started a rough draft for the 25-26 budget but at our next Executive meeting we need to discuss certain line items such as revamping the Renaissance program, did the teachers like the teacher grants, is PFC paying for counselors again?

Ways & Means

Taylor Gosney

- Ways and Means is basically fundraising which is a large part in how PFC supports the school and community. We raise funds for the Renaissance program, teacher appreciation, teacher grants and all other items in the budget. Coordinating the Otis Spunkmeyer which is our largest of the year and the monthly Dine and Donates. This position is heavily involved since it requires going to restaurants and petitioning them for the donation programs. We worked with the Treasurer and Communications of PFC and with Sequoia office staff. New this year we involved Leadership, the kids are really great in communicating out to their peers.
- We have the SF Giants fundraiser coming up. Which is a new fundraiser for Sequoia. You can purchase tickets through the link sent out on Parent Square and \$5 of every ticket goes back to the school.
- We are also looking at food fundraising options at Open House. We can sell pizzas and snacks at a PFC table. Since we are parents too and want to enjoy Open House we thought about recruiting Sequoia alumni to help.

 Communication is very involved. You will run the Facebook account which I post to multiple times throughout the week. Open Forum

- Parent Cristina Morena asked what the Renaissance program was?
 - Jennifer Bamberger explained it is based on grades. If your child has a 4.0 GPA they are Gold Star and they fill out an application to receive the reward for the Ouarter.
 - Taylor Gosney reminded parents that the program details are on the school website and it lists all the levels and grade point average a student needs.
- Treasure Christina Flint wants to discuss the draft 25-26 budget.
 - Christina asked Mr. Corbin if Counselors needed to be paid out of the PFC budget?
 - Mr. Corbin replied that Counselors have permanently been taken off of the PFC budget in an effort to support you all because I knew that you guys were having some issues with funding. I was able to divert that supplemental cost and use site funds for that.
 - Christina asked about the Renaissance program and what his plans to have it look like for next year? Currently, it is only funded to cover as a food based program just for 4.0 and above students. There have been discussions about making it look different.
 - Mr. Corbin replied, Carrie and myself have expressed some concerns about the Renaissance program. We know that we want to continue to provide some type of academic incentive for our high achieving students. Before sweet tomatoes went out of business in downtown Pleasant Hill the students were taken there during school as a break for lunch to do that and we've been trying to figure out different ways that we can continue Renaissance and provide a one of a kind experience, make it a

little different and add some variety to it. But it just seems like there's so many different limitations if we want to travel with 150 kids or so.

- Taylor Gosney agreed and thought this would be a great time to bring in the Leadership team. She offered to speak to Mr.
 Minglana and have the kids take a poll on what they would like to see and receive as rewards for this program since they are the ones it benefits.
- Jennifer Bamberger asked for verification that when the kids go off campus it can not be longer than an hour? Mr. Corbin said he would have to get clarification on that. Jennifer has spoken with the movie theatre and has talked them down to \$5 a student for a movie, if they are allowed to be off campus longer than an hour.
- Christina's last question regarding the budget is regarding the fundraising line.
 She wanted to discuss how to break it up rather than having all fundraising lumped into one line item.
 - Jennifer Bamberger said that it would be better to discuss at the Executive meeting, which needs to be rescheduled due to May 6th being the Music concert.
- Mr. Corbin mentioned he's been able to make some contacts with Off the Grid through the Pleasant Hill Education Commission and they are interested in providing some trucks for Open House. He didn't want to change any current plans we had but wanted to mention they are interested in providing services.
 - Taylor Gosney replied that she loved the idea and preferred food trucks that way no one needed to man a table but she wanted to make sure the vendors we would use are giving a percentage back to the school.
 - Mr. Corbin said that he would share the information with Taylor and that they are still working on final confirmation since the date has changed. He said they didn't mention anything about a fundraising support opportunity if they brought the food trucks to our site.
 - Taylor mentioned that fundraising back to the school is a big deal. We want to be able to get a little bit of fundraising efforts and if it's not Off the Grid that's fine, and if everybody is in agreement with it being a food truck or a couple of food trucks, then we can definitely look into options that that will provide some sort of partner with us in fundraising.
 - Nicole Evje agreed saying it's a great idea to have food trucks on campus, but they absolutely have to provide a kickback they're there to help us fundraise, not just for us to provide them business.
